Well, I'm hoping that you all had a great Saint Patrick's Day; we sure did! This time of year, the wearing of the green, and participating in general good times can be found in the strangest of places. At Chapter M's this month we got a surprise when the Chapter Director and his wife got into the spirit of Saint Patrick's Day and became leprechauns. There were games and other things with that holiday spirit. Creating themed events is not something new for our friends in Chapter M, which brings me to today's topic: Finding out what your chapter needs to enjoy themselves and to grow in popularity. This will not be an identical answer for all chapters. Each chapter is unique, and its members are sometimes looking for something different. Is your chapter a riding chapter, a dinner chapter, a games chapter or something else? The way to have a thriving chapter is to see what makes people tick. These are usually chapters that are well seasoned where most of the members are a little bit older and can spend a little less time in the saddle. The important thing to note is that there is no wrong answer. Each chapter has a personality, and the CD needs to take that into consideration. The hardest thing to come to grips with though is when a chapter's membership begins to drop off. This happens to every

chapter at some point. Sometimes it's due to people moving out of town, or giving up on riding, or spending more time with kids or grandkids. But at those times when the chapter is struggling is the time to shake things up a pivot. Change the gathering place to a different restaurant, or plan a few more rides including some overnights to locations of interest. New members with new bikes are generally looking for riding opportunities. As we move from March into April the weather will continue to get warmer and in between spring rain will be bright sunshine and clear roads. This is perfect time to explore places that perhaps you haven't seen before, or ride with people you haven't ridden with before. Keeping your eyes open for the spring rally season too. Chapter O always has a great Bluebonnets rally in Fredericksburg, which happens to be the weekend of April 9th this year. Additionally, Texas will be having its District "Yellow Rose" rally in Kerrville on April 28th 29th and 30th. There will be training opportunities, rides planned, and plenty of fun being organized. The district web page has details.

When was the last time you rode? What with the COVID pandemic being basically over, and winter's cold winds are now at our back, be aware that your skills on the bike might have relaxed a little bit. Make sure those batteries are charged, those tires are fully pressurized, that your gear still fits, and that you take things slow to begin with. We may not forget how to ride but riding safely is important. Those skills need a refresher! Hope to see you all out on the road soon.

Spring Safety Tips

It seems like just a few short weeks ago I was talking about winterizing your motorcycle. Luckily here in Texas the motorcycle riding season is year round unless interrupted by crazy weather. Even if your bike has not been in hibernation for the past few months, now is a good time to do a thorough check before heading out to the many upcoming rallies, a leisurely road trip or just to the corner store.

1. Check the bike's
 - Tires - pressure and weathering
 - Wheels for cracks and damage
 - All the controls including turn signals, low beams and gauges
 - All the fluids – break, clutch and coolant
 - Make sure your gas tank is filled
 - Steering and shocks, make sure steering is not grabbing
2. Don't forget about the trailer if you have one –
 - Ensure the ball is tight on the receiver
 - Hook up and chains are properly connected
 - Make sure wheel bearings are greased
 - Check your load capacity rating and don't exceed limits
 - Tires to ensure proper inflation and no flat spots from prolonged sitting

Don't forget to look for any damage or rust on the bike frame, trailer and their components.

3. Check your personal protective gear to make sure it is in good shape and serviceable.
 - Helmet – check for adequate lining and straps (unfrayed or untorn), shield without cracks
 - Gloves – replace your gloves if they show excessive wear and tear or damage
 - Boots – when left in the cold boots will sometimes crack. Take a look and make sure you have boots that are ready to go.

These few Spring Safety Tips should help you get moving along.
Hope to see you down the highway.

More than just planning a group ride and T-CLOCS

Spring has sprung. As fortunate as we are in Texas to have almost year-round riding, some of us don't get out as much as we'd like during the chilly months. Now that the weather is becoming more acceptable, we should consider a recheck on not only our bikes, but ourselves.

First, let's make sure our riding machine is in tip top shape.

Developing a motorcycle maintenance checklist can help you avoid costly (and unnecessary) repairs and potential safety issues. It's also a good idea to become familiar with your bike's owner's manual as maintenance requirements can vary between models. If you don't have the owner's manual, you'll likely find it available online.

Check these features regularly:

Tires: Stay aware of the tread depth and look for unusual wear patterns. Always make sure they're at the correct pressure; under-inflated tires are prone to blowouts and over-inflated tires wear more quickly. Here's a quick way to test the wear of your tires: insert a quarter between the grooves of the tire. If the tread doesn't reach past the top of Washington's head, it's probably time for new tires.

Oil: Check the level every week or so and top it off if necessary. Changing your oil is a simple, cheap way to keep your bike in good shape. If your bike is older or you drive it regularly for long distances, you'll need to change your oil more often. Synthetic oil is more expensive, but it makes the need for changes less frequent. Refer to your owner's manual for info on how often to change your bike's oil.

Lights and signals: Check your headlights, brake lights, high and low beams, and turn signals regularly. Since they won't necessarily show wear—and can actually just quit working suddenly—set up a reminder. The last thing you want is to be stranded because your lights stopped working.

Battery: Examine your battery and cables for corrosion or loose connections. Use a mixture of baking soda and water to clean the connections, then scrub with a household toothbrush. Use a voltmeter to test the battery and a charger if it's depleted. You don't want to be caught out on the road with a bike that won't start.

Brakes: Keep an eye on brake pad thickness and brake fluid level. When brake pads wear thin, your ability to stop quickly and efficiently is compromised. Top off low brake fluid to the "full" mark or change it according to your owner's manual instructions.

Oil, air, and fuel filters: Regularly check them to maintain optimal engine performance and efficiency. Your owner's manual will provide replacement intervals.

Last of all, get you ready. When was the last time you practiced the big three issues that are the usual suspects in any motorcycle incident? Braking, swerving, and cornering. A riding course or even a parking lot practice can help polish up those three things we all THINK we'll know how to handle if they occur.

The Texas District rally is offering an Advanced Riding Course for 2-wheeled vehicles, and a Trike Riding Course at the end of April. Either of these would be a great refresher before the height of the riding season is upon us.
