Hope you are all doing well!

Here it is mid-June and we've just passed the summer solstice. Statistically the days start getting shorter from here. However, we all know that the summer gets hotter than this. In the Dallas area we are now consistently hitting the low to mid 90s, and it's oppressively humid— this all thanks to the amount of rain that we've been receiving throughout the spring. As the hot humid weather hits, it reminds me of the motorcycle safety tip for riding in heat. Hydration is obviously important, but so is making sure that you keep skin covered at all times when riding in this heat. It is actually a mistake to think that if you wear a shorter sleeves that you will stay cooler. Somehow skin not shaded by fabric absorbs more ambient heat and can lead to heat stroke. One of the worst things about heat stroke is that even after you recover, you will continuously become more susceptible to it every time you overdo it. So, when planning your rides, try to find places of shade where you can hydrate and prepare yourself for the next leg of your journey.

As we head through summer, we look forward to our fall ride-in which will take place in Longview, Texas September 26th through the 28th. It's a good time right now to save these dates. We're in the process of securing the hotel and facilities that will accommodate us all a bit better than our event in Kerrville TX. Nothing was wrong with our hospitality room, but due to attendance being better than expected, that room was tight. Of course, the whole concept of these Ride-Ins is frugality and extra attention to riding. Longview has quite a few good restaurants, and as a former member of G2 roadrunners in Greenville, we spent a lot of time out there exploring the roads. Northeast Texas can be very pretty and the roads very spirited and scenic, so circle those dates on your calendar, and I look forward to seeing you there.

An item I want to touch on is following up with the news that GroupWorks will be shutting down tomorrow (it has already shut down as you read this—editor). We had sent out emails to this effect earlier this month. GWRRA had got the organization set up on this platform. Some loved it and some didn't use it. I know that in North Texas it had become a staple in announcing rides and chapter events. The benefit was that it kept multiple chapters In Sync with what each other was doing. Many a Chapter P ride was attended by the surrounding chapters due to

this platform. But as is the case with most things, everything must come to a close at some point. So there [are] many ways that you can continue communications with your chapter members. Some may opt to use Facebook which allows the sharing of pictures and it's openness to allow others to join the Facebook page to learn more about us. It is also true though that many view Facebook with a lot of criticism. You do give up a bit of your privacy to belong, and I have never seen a platform that is so eager to advertise products that my wife and I had just been discussing casually but never did a Google search on. Other chapters used to use their own web pages or emails to communicate. This requires the Chapter Director, or whoever does the communications to send emails in such a way that we respect the privacy of our membership. When sending emails to members, use "BCC" instead of "TO". The benefit of this is [that] no member will see the e-mail addresses of those also being copied. It is up to your chapter on how you want to proceed, but it is likely we will have to do a mixture of options. There are even a few who do not want to get e-mail and prefer to get text messages. It's not too difficult to accommodate those folks as each phone carrier has a domain that you can enter the phone number into to send your e-mail to a phone. Reach out to me if you'd like to know more.

One last thing to let people know about is that after some discussions, our new District Director has volunteered to take over at the end of the year when we step back. Lyle Altes will be the new District Director, with Jim Evans being his Assistant District Director for 2025. Donna and I will remain available to assist the district in any and all ways requested to ensure a smooth transition, and the greatest chances for success. After four years as district director, I can assure you that the greatest success possible is when we get blood transfusion into the organization and Donna and I step back. I am not quite sure what the staff will look like, but that will be up to the new team to work through.

I hope you all stay healthy and happy throughout these summer months, and we look forward to seeing you as soon as possible.

Road Ready

MAKE SURE YOU ARE PROPERLY LICENSED

Driving a car and riding a motorcycle require different skills and knowledge. Although motorcycle-licensing regulations vary, all states require a motorcycle license endorsement to supplement your automobile driver's license. To receive the proper endorsement in most states, you'll need to pass written and on-cycle skills tests administered by your state's licensing agency. Some states require you to take a state-sponsored rider education course. Others waive the on-cycle skills test if you've already taken and passed a state-approved course. Either way, completing a motorcycle rider education course is a good way to ensure you have the correct instruction and experience it takes to ride a motorcycle. Contact your state motor vehicle administration to find a motorcycle rider-training course near you.

Of the motorcycle operators involved in fatal crashes in 2022, 35% were riding without valid motorcycle licenses.

PRACTICE OPERATING YOUR MOTORCYCLE

Given the fact that motorcycles vary in handling and responsiveness, be sure to take the time to get accustomed to the feel of a new or unfamiliar motorcycle by riding it in a controlled area. Once you feel comfortable with your bike, you can take it into traffic. Make sure you know how to handle your motorcycle in a variety of conditions (e.g., inclement weather or encountering hazards such as slick roads, potholes, and road debris).

BEFORE EVERY RIDE

Check your motorcycle's tire pressure and tread depth, hand and foot brakes, headlights and signal indicators, and fluid levels before you ride. You should also check under the motorcycle for signs of oil or gas leaks. If you're carrying cargo, you should secure and balance the load on the cycle; and adjust the suspension and tire pressure to accommodate the extra weight. If you're carrying a passenger, he or she should mount the motorcycle only after the engine has started; should sit as far forward as possible, directly behind you; and should keep both feet on the foot rests at all times, even when the motorcycle is stopped. Remind your passenger to keep his or her legs and feet away from the muffler. Tell your passenger to hold on firmly to your waist, hips, or belt; keep movement to a minimum; and lean at the same time and in the same direction as you do. Do not let your passenger dismount the motorcycle until you say it is safe.

Top 6 Tips for Staying Safe on Your Motorcycle During the Summer

In an ideal world, drivers behind the wheel of cars and trucks would prioritize safety above all else. They would look twice at intersections and when changing lanes, and they would do everything within their power to avoid collisions with other vehicles, especially motorcycles. Motorcyclists are much more vulnerable than drivers and passengers in cars and trucks, so drivers of cars and trucks should make an extra effort to keep the roads safe for motorcyclists.

While some drivers do this, many don't, which is unfortunate and can sometimes lead to tragedy. However, there are steps that motorcyclists can take to stay safe on the roads even if drivers of cars and trucks don't operate their vehicles as safely as they should. Here are the top six summer motorcycle safety tips:


- Check Your Bike Inspect your motorcycle. Make sure everything is in great shape. Check the lights, motor, tires, brakes, horn, and mirrors. If possible, have a mechanic check it out as well. Mechanical issues can leave you stranded out on the road or result in an accident. You should do everything you can to catch those issues before you head out on the road. Remember use the TCLOCS method (*Tires and wheels, Controls, Lights and electric, Oil and other fluids, Chassis and chain, and Stands*).
- Check Your Gear Your gear can sometimes be the only thing between you and serious injury if you're involved in a wreck. Make sure you have everything you need and that it is all in top condition. Safety equipment you should have includes a helmet, boots, jacket, reflective clothing/gear, pants, elbow, knee, and shin guards, and gloves. While it might be tempting to ride wearing just shorts, sneakers, a t-shirt, and no helmet, if you're in a wreck, you could really regret not wearing proper protective gear.
- **Check the Weather** When we think about summer, we picture sunny skies and beautiful weather. However, storms are a part of summer too, so make sure to keep an eye on the weather before you go out riding. Wet roads and low visibility are never safe conditions to ride in.
- Check the Road Conditions This is both something to check on before you ride and while you're riding. Road conditions are always changing. If you know there's going to be construction on your route, maybe take a different route. Or if you notice a lot of fallen tree branches and other debris along your usual route, it might be wise to take a detour. When at all possible, try to ride on roads that are free of debris and other hazards
- Check Yourself Make sure you're riding safely. Review best practices before riding, especially if you haven't ridden your motorcycle in a while. Also, never ride your motorcycle if you have been drinking or are impaired in any way.
- Check the Laws Laws change more often than many of us realize. Before heading back out on your motorcycle. Check the laws to make sure you know what is legal and what is not. Lane splitting is one controversial issue that many motorcyclists don't realize is illegal in many states. In addition, it is a dangerous practice that can result in accidents and serious injury.

Making and using Google Groups

How to stay in touch with your members now that **GroupWorks** is gone. Below is one method of sending out emails to a group using Google Groups app.

First you will of course need a Google email account. If you do not already have one for your chapter you should create one. Once you are logged into your Google email account open a window and type in https://groups.Google.com If you do not have a group established you can create one on the left panel of the page. If you do not see the (+Create Group) tab, click on the three horizontal lines to the left of the two blue people.



When you click on the + Create Group tag it will take you to page 1 of 3 for creating a group. Enter the name of the group. The Group email (note it will be Name@Googlegroups.com), And a description of the group. The description will be sent when you add email to the group.

Next page you will be choosing privacy settings. Who can search for Group (it is best to leave the setting at *Group Members*). Who can join Group (for now use only invited). For the next three options, Who can view Conversations (Group Members), Who can post (it is best to use group managers) Who can view members (group members).

Page 3 is to add members, I think you can copy and paste a list of email's you might have already prepared. Complete the invitation message with Info about the group. You may want to add the end of the message if they wish to not receive messages they can use the Unsubscribe option at the bottom of any message that is sent via the group email. Last click on Directly add members. To finalize go to the top right and click on Create group

Note

Once the group is created managers can add and remove members. Go to the left panel and you will see a People / Members click on. This will show you a list of members and on the list you (as the owner) can change the Role (Owner, Manager, or Member). You can also change the Subscription (each email, Digest, Abridged, No email), You can also change the Posting (Not allowed, Allowed, Moderated). Again I suggest to only use the allowed for the folks you wish to send out messages to the group (Director, Ride Coordinator, Editor, etc). Also, while at the Members panel you can add additional Members the ability is at the top of the list.

If you have any issues completing the above process you can contact the webmaster for some additional help. You might also look for help by typing in a search engine Help on Google Groups.
